### A Note from Pastor Laura

Dear Church.

July is an exciting month for me because it means I get to go back to work! Yes, I get to go back. # Update from Session - we're now a More Light congregation!

At the June meeting of Session, the leadership continued years of tradition at LPC in being a church that is open, affirming, and inclusive by officially voting to become a More Light community. More Light is a Presbyteriancentered advocacy group that works to make the church safe and abundant for LGBTQ+ Christians. This vote is similar to our Presbyterians for Earth Care vote, in that it connects us with a larger, national network to support our local church work.

Here is the complete statement that was voted on: "Following the risen Christ, and seeking to make the Church a true community of hospitality, the mission of More Light Presbyterians is to work for the full participation of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer (LGBTQ) people in the life, ministry and witness of the Presbyterian Church (USA) and in society."

The Session had already affirmed the theology of the church in multiple votes before, but this action allows us to be listed on the More Light Church database so that we may be found by those seeking an affirming church in the area.

What a great culmination of the work Lakewood Presbyterian Church has done for years around being welcoming neighbors to God's people!
