Dear Friends and Members of Lakewood Presbyterian Church,

Our Temporary Supply Pastor, Pastor Addie!



Rev. Addie Domske (she/her) was rooted and raised in rural America, spent her early professional life in urban spaces, and found herself recently doing ministry in exurban tech hubs like California's Silicon Valley and the Seattle area. Because of that she has love for what the church was, what the church is, and what the church can be. Originally from a little borough north of Pittsburgh, Addie sees God working in the world through justice movements. She is especially attuned to theology that is queer, anti-colonial, and that combats anti-Blackness. She believes trees have something deeply theological to teach us and feels closest to God when laughing.

In May of 2022, Addie had a host of fabulous folks supporting her own parental leave when she welcomed her baby Sagan Jan-Zi Domske into the world. Addie is excited to spend this sacred season with LPC to learn from you, to support Laura in nurturing her new family members into the world, and to have good conversations together about God. Addie lives in Snohomish with her spouse Dan, 2 year old Sagan, and a menagerie of animals including two turtles, a bearded dragon, an aquatic frog, and a black cat named Bissa (بسة).



Our Church Pianist - Xiaohui Yang

Xiaohui Yang is a Juilliard- trained classical pianist who has preformed around the globe and now is our new church pianist! Xiaohui and her husband Ronaldo Rolim moved from Philadelphia to University Place a year and a half ago when he took a position as the


Assistant Professor of Piano at University of Puget Sound. Prior to her daughter Maya's birth in October, Xiaohui travelled often for performances around the country and the world, so she hasn't had the opportunity to get to know the people in this community. When her daughter Maya was born in September last year, she had to slow down her performing schedule, and she is enjoying being settled here for a longer stretch of time. Even though finding time to practice has become much more challenging, Xiaohui is still so grateful that she can spend this precious time with Maya and be able to witness every little change she makes everyday. Xiaohui heard about the position from her husband and agreed to work with us on a temporary basis, as her schedule allows. She says, "it's so wonderful to be part of the community, have the opportunity to get to know people here, and share beautiful music together."

Xiaohui will often be bringing her daughter Maya with her on Sundays. Maya started traveling with her for performances when she was only 7 weeks old and she has already been to 9 states. Because of the amount of music she has to bear with from her pianist parents every single day, she could sit on her bouncing chair and listen to them practice for about 45 min and has been able to sit and listen to concerts that last a little over an hour!

Easter Egg Hunt!

Our annual community Easter Egg Hunt will be held on Saturday March 23rd at 11 am SHARP with a lunch to follow. There will be separate spaces for kids of different ages so that all have an opportunity to find eggs! Palm Sunday

On Palm Sunday, we will be doing a "Palms to Passion" liturgy that follow from Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem through to the Passion narrative on the cross. The service will include a responsive storytelling of the Passion Narrative that involves the whole congregation. Join us afterward for our annual pancake breakfast!



Maundy Thursday

Join us for the Maundy Thursday service where we gather to remember Jesus' last gathering with his disciples around the Table. The service is held in the Fellowship Hall with a simple meal meant to represent the Last Supper, although you should plan to eat dinner beforehand since it isn't a full meal. The service includes a reading of the gospels and the celebration of the Eucharist.



Good Friday

Join us for a "7 Last Words" tenebré service on Good Friday at 12:00pm. This is one of the holiest days of the year and is a very meaningful way to prepare for Easter. The service is a time for meditation and reflection on Jesus' last words on "the hardest and holiest day of the church year" as author Kate Bowler says.
