A Note from Session about the Feasibility Study...

Session is currently in the process of a Church Feasibility Study, which will conclude in December 2024. The intent and purpose of this study is to assist and determine the best course of action for the future life of our church. Session is working with Rev. Heather James, who was recommended by The Olympia Presbytery as a consultant/facilitator. The process will include analyzing and identifying the dreams, vision, and values of congregation members, analyzing future finances, buildings and grounds, strategic property usage possibilities, and mission opportunities. The process is guided by hope and possibility--to what and where could God be leading us next? The hope is that Session can discern the information gained from this study and lead our church into an abundant future.

We invite you to participate in the study by answering community questions each Sunday. Look for an invite to a community-wide neighborhood event in June!

A Letter from Heather James...

It was a joy to meet with the Lakewood Presbyterian Church congregation back in March and hear your stories about your life of faith in community. Your love for one another is evident, and your hope for the church is powerful.

The consulting work I do allows me to come alongside congregations and join them in discerning how God is calling them forward into a hopeful future. Your Session has initiated a feasibility study to gather information that can help with that discernment. And with your newly installed pastor, you have great leadership to guide you as your Session and you, the congregation, consider what might be possible in the next season of your ministry together.

A feasibility study is different from the mission study you participated in during the pastoral search. There are some ways they are similar, but the goal of the feasibility study is to gather data and prayerfully reflect on all the opportunities before you. The study looks at congregational membership and energy, financial realities, the building and grounds, the needs of the neighborhood, and other dynamic factors that are a part of the life of the church. You will then want to look at the possibilities that emerge from that data and consider ways that God might be calling you to meet this moment for both the nurture of the church and for the sake of the community around you.

This particular feasibility study is building on the work your congregation has already done in the recent mission study and the Facilities Master Plan done in January 2022. The study is also informed by your faithful decision to hire a full time pastor for a period of two years in order to see what grows and blossoms among you. There will be opportunities moving forward to offer your reflections and input about where you see God at work in this season.

Your congregation is in great hands with your capable Session, as well as with Pastor Laura and Pastor Addie. All the decisions about what opportunities you will pursue belong to you, with the leadership of the Session. My hope is that our time of study together will illuminate possibilities and provide support for your congregation as you discern together how God might be calling you in new ways and with new hope in this new season.
