
Hello beloveds!

Finance Update From lim Hall, Treasurer

We are **\$5,945** in the **RED** for the month of September and likely by a similar amount for October's general expenses.

In addition, November will see a lot of money being spent on building maintenance. We need to fix the leaking roof, which will cost \$16,500 at best. We are also doing some band-aid fixes on the plumbing for \$7,100. And finally, we are planning to replace one of our 30 year old furnaces, which will cost about \$3,000. These costs add up to at least \$26,600 for maintenance, which doesn't include our regular expenses.

If anyone is able to add to their monthly/yearly giving, it will really help our reserve funds are being depleted fairly quickly.

Thank you for your prayerful consideration of making an additional gift to cover these maintenance expenses.

Feasibility Study Update

As you may know, the Session has been engaged in a vear-long Feasibility Study to examine our resources, obstacles, and vision for purpose in the world. That process began with surveying the congregation (you may remember filling out post-it note surveys back in the summer). The Session analyzed those results and now Pastor Laura is working with Pastor Addie Domske to put forth a "menu of options" for our future. This month, Session will be meeting to go over those options and begin discerning which options we have the energy, hope, imagination, and love to pursue.

What can you do?

Pray for your leaders! Discernment is hard work and there are big decisions that need to be made. This work also requires a lot of time and energy out of our volunteer leaders. Remind them that you value their sacrificial work.
